FILM DISCUSSION

Film Media Club conducted Deep Focus- Mullappoo Film Festival on 11-01-16 at MSK hall. As a part of the festival, conducted a film seminar on 'Arab Cinema – Prathyaasakalum Asankakalum'. Presented by Film critic Noushad (Assistant Professor, Safi college Vazhayoor)

'In a related arena, an increasing number of television dramas are being made for trans-Arab distribution. After Egypt, Syria has become the second-largest producer of television drama and comedy. In 2004 more than seventy television shows were produced in Syria, most of which were widely distributed and extremely popular around the Arab world, particularly in the Gulf States. Greater relaxation of government restriction on private industries, combined with the recent building of major film and television production facilities near Damascus and the influx of business investments from various Gulf countries, together have created a potentially major base for a trans-Arab film and television industry based in Syria. Moreover, the overwhelming majority of movie theaters around the region remain locally owned and operated, enhancing possibilities for the growth of Arab national cinema and encouraging more diversity in film programming. At the most basic level, these theaters ensure that films from across the Arab world can be seen by other Arabs'- he says.

A Separation and Colour of Paradise were screened at the festival. Principal AM Rasheed, Prof Kadavanad Mohammed, CT Aboobacker felicitated the programme.

"Around the world, women are far less likely than men to be seen in the media. As subjects of stories, women only appear in a quarter of television, radio, and print news. In a 2015 report, women made up a mere 19% of experts featured in news stories and 37% of reporters telling stories globally. As behavioral scientists studying women's under representation in the workplace, we know that this gender-imbalanced picture of society can reinforce and perpetuate harmful gender stereotypes"- says Sebastian paul.

Conducted film festival and seminar. Film director Dr. Biju inaugurated the festival and screened his film 'Veyil Marangal'. This film is a testimony to Dr Biju's poetic approach to a socially relevant theme. He discusses the caste system, never-ending exploitation of the underprivileged and the growth of the feudal system at the expense of the sweat dropped by the working class. The drama is subsided here where visuals speak eloquently. The late cinematographer MJ Radhakrishnan has given a spectacular job as he has captured aesthetically the landscape of nature and its fury alike. The crucial visuals have a strong resemblance to the

paintings with surrealistic ideas. Accompanied by a simple and subtle presentation, the metaphoric visuals remind us of the burning reality of survival.

Dr. Biju says" It might be an irony that the filmmaker gives a colourful interpretation to the struggling tale of the marginalized section. Indrans is perfect casting as the hapless protagonist, who is destined to live as an alien on his home soil. The stranded people mired in legal formalities are the real "trees under the sun" as the title notes. The dream sequences evoke their unquenched desire to carry on in life"

SEMINAR

Conducted a film related talk by film director Shanavas Bhavakkutty on 13-011-19 at EK hall . He talked about his film 'Thottappan'. Adapting a literary work to screen is often a tightrope walk between retaining and leaving out one part or the other. In adapting Francis Noronha's original story Thottappan, which was much talked about in Malayalam literary circles , screen writer P S Rafeeque depends on just the base story; he deviates considerably and even fleshes out seemingly insignificant parts effectively.

Shanavas pointed out the disparate elements and the sub-plots bring alive quite a few memorable moments, yet in the end, when it all comes together, it does not shake you enough for the kind of story it sets out to tell. It could be due to the flab that got into the script while fleshing out the story, like the pointless and prolonged sequence of Thottappan's attack on a man who had raped a domestic help. This failing is noticeable since Noronha's writing itself is known for cutting out the flab.




SEMINAR

He says, "Even as India stayed home during the pandemic, Malayalam films travelled across the country, and the globe. What started as a trickle in years became a deluge on the back of slick subtitling, faster internet speed and multiple streaming services. People who had not even heard of cinema from Kerala a few years back now crown it as the most forward thinking and rooted industry in the country. The 'Newgen cinema' took aficionados by storm. While elsewhere film industries were busy building up superstars, Malayalam cinema served ordinary human stories that cinema has often relegated to edges. As we celebrate the new champions of the films, not many know that its foundations were laid decades ago."

He pointed 'At the beginning of the 50s, a group of young actors entered Malayalam filmdom, paving the way for a new era. It was during this decade that the evergreen heroes, Sathyan and Prem Naseer, arrived on the scene and went on to acquire a permanent and special place in the hearts of Keralites. By the end of the decade, there was a pantheon of talented actors in the field who played a crucial role in the growth of the industry. They included, apart from Sathyan and Naseer, the hugely popular heroines Sheela and Sharada, as well as actors like Ummer, P. J. Antony, Kottarakkara Sreedharan Nair, Adoor Bhasi and Bahadur. In 1961 Kandam Becha Kottu, the first Malayalam movie in colour, was released'
